Understanding and finding treatment can be challenging, and not one fits all. The help of a family member, friend or person in recovery can be important. Ask many questions. Even the terminology varies. The basics:

Medical Detoxification facilities – patient stays for medical supervision during withdrawal that can be painful, even life-threatening. Early opiate withdrawal is less risky, but extended use, other drugs, physical and/or mental health problems may make this setting best. Length of stay varies. Federal money is trickling down; GA has been utilizing.

Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) - evidence-based practice to replace opioids with safer medications (such as methadone, buprenorphine, extended-release naltrexone) in detox and then recovery.

(cont.)

Inpatient Rehab/Residential Treatment programs – short or long term, away from home. Some include “subacute detox” for less medical needs. Some do not provide medical services. Highly focused on solidifying recovery.

Intensive Outpatient Programs (IOP) – allow for work, school and regular activities while providing services and supports, such as a 12-step program to remain sober.

Peer Support Specialist – someone living in recovery for at least one year who provides support to others through experiences. GA or NC Certification means training requirements have been met.

Transitional or Half-Way Housing – temporary living place after detox, usually up to 24 months, with wrap-around services to help people stabilize their lives and avoid triggers.

Permanent Supportive Housing - safe, affordable, stable housing with voluntary, flexible supports and services. Studies show this as key component to recovery from Opioid Use Disorder (OUD), more than with any other abused substance.
